

Asbestos Policy

All Saints' Church, Walsoken

Specific Policy

This Health & Safety (H&S) sub-policy controls asbestos or asbestos containing material (ACM) at church.

Introduction

Asbestos is a naturally occurring, fibrous material which if inhaled can cause serious diseases. These include cancers of the lungs and chest linings, which can take many years to develop following exposure.

The use of asbestos or (ACM) in construction or refurbishment was banned in 2000. However, prior to this asbestos was widely used, so can potentially be found in any premises, particularly if they were built, refurbished, altered or extended during the twentieth century.

Where asbestos (or ACM) is present, exposure can generally result when it is disturbed, damaged or is just in a poor condition. Therefore, those people who are most at risk are those carrying out maintenance and repair jobs. This could be builders, roofers, electricians, painters, decorators, joiners, plumbers, gas fitters, plasterers, heating engineers or surveyors.

The only building work in All Saints' Church, Walsoken during the 20th century using, the then contemporary, asbestos (or ACM) were

- 1) The external boiler house.
- 2) The installation of the kitchen and toilet when the ringing area was raised.

Legal Requirements

Note: Work with asbestos and ACM can only be carried out by licenced contractors according to safety guidelines. The congregation or visitors must <u>not</u> interact with asbestos or ACM.

The PCC have a legal requirement to manage asbestos or ACM as the church is a non-domestic property for which they have formal control.

Procedure

The PCC at All Saints' Church, Walsoken must

- 1) Identify what asbestos and ACM are present at church. Label it in its location. Its condition is assessed annually. We retain a written record of this.
- 2) Keep a record of any asbestos work.
- 3) Assess the risk from any ACMs that might be present and retain a written record of this. (see document H&S_Doc_0001)
- 4) Ensure that a written plan to manage the risk from any ACMs is prepared. Implement the requirements of the plan to make sure that any asbestos or ACMs are known to be in good condition and are removed, repaired, protected and labelled where necessary (see document H&S_Doc_0002).
- 5) Provide information on the location and condition of the asbestos or ACM to anyone who is liable to disturb it or is otherwise potentially at risk (e.g. emergency services).
- 6) Keep a records of works done on asbestos or ACM. (see church document H&S_Doc_0003 Annual report & Asbestos).
- 7) Provide relevant information to those that need it where you are planning construction work.
- 8) This procedure documents the church's arrangements and responsibilities for managing asbestos or ACM.

Diagram 1. Indicative ACM locations at church




Diagram 2. Asbestos Warning in Boiler house
